ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The Consortium is open to Ph.D. and Sc.D. students at Harvard who have completed at least one year in their home department or school, and can demonstrate that participation in the Consortium will advance the goals of their research. Once admitted, students are required to participate in a weekly reading seminar that provides an overview of the energy field, and to complete three courses:

- Energy Consequences Provides an introduction to the physical and chemical impacts of energy choices on human society and natural ecosystems.
- Energy Technology Assesses current and anticipated future technologies for energy generation, interconversion, storage, and end usage, including both current and projected world energy use.
- Energy Policy Introduces students to the design, implementation and assessment of energy policy from national and global perspectives, and provides them with the basic tools used to analyze and assess energy options.
