ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The Consortium is open to Ph.D. students at Harvard who have completed at least one year in their home department or school, and can demonstrate that participation in the Consortium will advance the goals of their research. Once admitted, students are required to participate in a weekly reading seminar that provides an overview of the energy field, and to complete three courses:

- **Energy Consequences (Fall 2011)** – Taught by Daniel Schrag, Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences
- **Energy Technology (Spring 2012)** – Taught by Michael Aziz, School of Engineering and Applied Sciences

AND EITHER

- **Energy Policy (Spring 2012)** – Taught by Joseph Aldy, Harvard Kennedy School

OR

- **Energy Security (Fall 2011)** – Taught by Meghan O’Sullivan, Harvard Kennedy School
