



## *Position Opening – Brandeis University Adjunct Lecturer in Psychology (Part-time)*

The Department of Psychology, Brandeis University invites applications for a Lecturer to teach the following course the fall semester of 2015:

***Human Memory (NPSY-154):*** *This advanced seminar course (including upper-level undergraduate, masters, and PhD students) presents a systematic analysis of memory research and theory, with special emphasis on current research employing cognitive neuroscience methods, such as fMRI*

This course is currently scheduled to be taught on Monday and Wednesday, 5:00 p.m. until 6:20 p.m., over the over the course of the 14 week semester. Office hours are required to a minimum of 3 hours weekly.
