The Psychology Department at the University of New Hampshire invites applications for a tenure-track position in Behavioral Neuroscience at the Assistant Professor level to begin fall, 2015. This position is part of a cluster hire designed to strengthen the inter-college major in Neuroscience and Behavior <<http://neuroscience.unh.edu>>. We seek to hire an individual using animal models. The area within Behavioral Neuroscience is open. UNH actively creates an educational environment that fosters diversity, inclusion and quality engagement for all.

History of or strong potential for external funding is highly desirable. Requirements: Ph.D. in psychology or neuroscience with appropriate specialization; strong record of research and teaching. The successful applicant will teach courses in specialty areas and in other areas of need in the department. All faculty are expected to teach a course in Introductory Psychology, Statistics, or Research Methods; supervise doctoral and undergraduate student research; and advise undergraduate students. Applicants should show a commitment to sustain and advance the goals of the institution's diversity of students, faculty, and staff.

Review of applications begins October, 15th and will continue until the position is filled.
